Reflection from Father Angelo

“Here I am, Lord; I come to do your will” (Psalm 40) / “If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts” (Psalm 95). These are the two phrases that spoke to me this week during the daily masses. Readiness to serve and docility of the heart are necessary in the life of a believer.

Everything about the christian life should be centered on obedience and selflessness. The earthly life of Jesus as the son of God was focused on doing the will of the Father. No matter how challenging it may be, Jesus, in the end, fully surrendered everything for the fulfillment of God’s will. His earthly life was never about himself but always for others.

Our challenge sometimes is that we want to follow Christ but we can’t seem to set aside our ego at the same time. We go to church, we listen to the word of God and even receive Christ in the eucharist but remain unchanged by the whole encounter. Why? Because to receive Christ means to be ready to serve and have docility of the heart.

As we find ourselves immersed in our parish life, let us be servants who truly desire to serve God and others and not simply our own interests. I invite you to reflect on these questions: Am I really doing God’s will? Do I set aside what I want to make room for God’s mission?
