#### MESSAGE FROM FATHER ANGELO

Do people see Christ in you? Christianity reminds us to see the face of Christ in others, but sometimes we forget as well, that allowing others to see Christ in us is as important. The intercession on Wednesday's morning prayer says "Give us strength to be patient with those we meet today, AND SO IMITATE YOU". They key to discipleship is imitation of Christ. Do we mirror his love? Do we forgive as he does? Do we learn to pray for our enemies and those who persecute us?

As I have mentioned in my homily last weekend, we can never please everyone. What is most important is that we please our Father in heaven. Jesus ended up on the cross even though all he did was heal, love, serve and forgive. Our faith is founded on and grounded in sacrificial, selfless and unconditional love. To imitate Christ is to focus on Him and learn from His ways. We can't fake our way to eternity. The Christian life should be rooted in authenticity and inner transformation. The scribes and pharisees at the time of Jesus may appear perfect in their outward appearance and practices, but their hearts are far from the Lord. They failed to imitate the God of love that they worship.

Imitation of Christ requires change and growth. We can't grow in holiness without constantly accepting the daily challenge of becoming better today than we were yesterday. A community of faith could only truly become the One Body of Christ if we take on the task of becoming the hands and feet of Christ to others. I invite you this week to include in your prayer and reflection your response to the question: Do people see Christ in me?
